CONCEPT NOTE

WOMEN'S WRITING AND WRITING ABOUT WOMEN: **REWRITING GENDER AND IDENTITY IN** INDIAN ENGLISH LITERATURE

The academic discipline of Women's Writing as a discrete area of literary studies is based on the notion that the experience of women, historically, has been shaped by their gendered identity, i.e. their position as women within the literary world. The tradition of women's writing has been much ignored due to the inferior position women have held in male-dominated societies. In her path-breaking book The Second Sex, Simone de Beauvoir argues that human subjectivity is egregiously centered on the male concept of selfhood relegating the woman to the status of the 'other', and the pity is that cultural representations like myths, religion, literature and even popular culture are so much characterized by gender bias that women internalize them in their formative years. In the West, resistance against this came with the First Wave of feminism. But it was during the Second Wave that women writers have realized the need to have 'a literature of their own' to express themselves. Virginia Woolf's A Room of One's Own is often considered a driving force behind this movement which advocates for the necessity of both a metaphorical and literal "room" for women's literature within the literary tradition. But the situation is not the same in the context of Indian society. Historical circumstances and values in India make women's issues different from the western feminist rhetoric. In India the process of bringing women back to power starts after the arrival of the British. Till then, they have always been represented by their male counterparts, whether it's in social sphere or in literature. It was after the Independence that there occurs a growing consciousness among women writers to vindicate their protest by writing about themselves and by trying to dismantle the traditional

domesticated image of Indian women. Writers like Kamala Das, Kamla Markandaya, Shashi Deshpande, Shobhaa De, Eunice de Souza, Meena Kandasamy and others have successfully deve Joped a genre that can be termed as 'Indian English Women's

Writing'. The objective of this seminar is to make a scho larly discussion about Indian Enalish women's writing both on literal and theoretical arounds to bring into focus how much these writers have succeeded in rewriting their gender and identity in the Indian con
